

NTSA Skeet League starts March 17... SIGN UP TODAY AT THE CLUB

This is a 90% handicap league for teams. The targets are not registered. NNSA (www.mynssa.com/image/downloads/2007-NNSA-Rules.pdf.) rules apply except as modified in subsequent paragraphs or by a grievance jury. The league will run for 8 weeks starting on 03/17/2010 and ending 05/22/2010 with a awards picnic and fun shoot on a date to be determined.

FEES: Team captains are responsible for collecting and turning in all fees to the league Chair or Rep. The fees per person are \$100.00. The breakdown is \$10.00 per week for 50 birds (8 weeks x \$10.00 = \$80.00 plus \$20 = \$100.00 for targets, awards and the picnic.

Each participant shall shoot 16 rounds between 03/17/2010 and 05/22/2010. The \$20.00 league fee must be paid in advanced. No fees will be refunded after a participant shoots their first round. Any participant not shooting the required 16 rounds is not eligible for awards.

TEAMS: A team may consist of up to 5 shooters. Each team will select a captain. You form your team or the league can assign you to a team. The best 3 handicapped scores from your team will be used each week for the team competition. Substitutes can be used but a subs score will be scratch...no handicap

GUNS: NTSA range rules apply regarding appropriate guns and ammunition. Within those rules, any 12, 20, 28, or 410 gauge gun may be used during league competition.

REFEREES/SCORE SHEETS: Teams waiting to shoot will pull, score and referee for teams that are shooting and vice versa. If no teams waiting to shoot are available any NTSA member can score and pull targets. Shooters must initial their score sheets and team captains are responsible to return them to the league chair or his rep.

LEAGUE SHOOTS: Saturday and Wednesday are the official league days starting at 12:00 pm. Shoot aheads and make ups can be shot any day of the week during normal club operating hours.

NOTICE REGARDING PRACTICE ROUNDS AND SHOOT AHEADS: A shooter is allowed to shoot one round of 50 birds ahead and the round must be witnessed and scored by a non team member. It shall be the responsibility of the person shooting ahead to shedule the make-up or shoot-ahead round. All shoot-aheads and make-up rounds must be shot at the NTSA Range.

In accordance with NTSA Range Rules which states that non-members can shoot only as guests of members, non-members in the league who desire to shoot-ahead or shoot practice rounds prior to the matches may do so only if they are accompanied by a NTSA club member acting as their sponsor and pay the NTSA non-member \$10.00 daily fee plus target costs. A participant may shoot a practice round during league times/shoots, but that intention must be indicated to the squad leader/score keeper before firing at any station.

HANDICAP: On the opening day of the league, handicaps will be computed and added to the individual scores after the shoot or the shooter can shoot 50 birds sometime before the league starts to establish a handicap. Note NNSA members may choose to use their NNSA average for the gauge of gun they chose to start the season with. Handicap will be 90% of the difference between a shooter's average and 50. Handicaps will change weekly and, with the exceptions above, will be based on the last 100 targets fired. Score plus handicap cannot exceed 50.

AWARDS: Team award will be based on the team with the highest average at the end of the 8 week season based on the best three handicap scores each week. Individual awards will be given for most perfect rounds (25 straight scratch score) shooter, highest handicap score shooter, and most improved shooter raw score (i.e. whose handicap has shrunk the most between the first shoot and the last shoot). A single participant will not be awarded a prize in more than one category.

RESOLUTION OF TIES: In the event of a tie for team award with the highest handicapped averages, the winner will be determined by the results of head-to-head competition for one round of skeet. Ties for individual awards will be resolved in the same manner. When a shooter qualifies for more than one individual award, only the higher will be awarded.

GRIEVANCE JURY: Consists of team captains present, league chair and rep. Any team captain can request a meeting to resolve an issue.
