## **Safety Notices**

- Make sure that your fired rounds impact into the berm and do not skip off of the ground.
- <u>All shooters on the rifle and pistol ranges should ensure that the rounds they fire pass through</u> <u>the black plastic backers and impact into the berms</u>. Please place targets in the center of the plastic backer and avoid shooting the wood frames or the metal posts.

The meeting will begin at 5 PM and end at 9 PM. Dinner will be served at 5:30 PM. The cost of the dinner is \$10 per person. The land acquisition will be discussed with the membership attending as well as a proposed list of improvements to the club in 2011. An election will be held for four Board members. There are no proposed by-law changes. Thanks to member Margaret Hall for reserving the Denton Country Club.

#### **December Board Meeting**

The December Board meeting was held on December 8<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 PM. The main agenda item under old business was the land acquisition, the winter business meeting, an update on the portable sporting clay machines, and a list of club improvements for 2011.

The Board received and voted in three membership transfers.

Member George Clutter brought the monthly treasurer's report for the period ending November 2010, which was distributed to all members present.

Under old business, the Board discussed the acquisition of the 234 acre property to the west. The Board discussed various amounts and agreed on an amount to offer the owners. Although this amount is below the asking price, it is hoped that the owners will take into consideration the \$70K per year of interest that they will gain over a 10 year period, if they carry the note. As stated last month, about 80-85% of the 234 acre property is located within flood plain which would be excellent for recreational use and would keep the price per acre relatively low. The flood plain property is worth about \$2500 per acre. The remaining 15-20% is currently worth from \$7 - 10K per acre. The realtor believes the current value of the entire property is estimated at \$750 - 820K, which is well below the asking price now of \$1,000,000. Although it was discussed last month, the BOD did not develop the criteria to give to the realtor to search for other properties within a 5-10 mile area.

The Trap Chairman reported that thanks to member Margaret Hall, the Denton Country Club (DCC) has been reserved for Saturday, January 8<sup>th</sup> from 5 PM to 9 PM for 110 members. As in the past, the cost per person for the dinner will be \$10 each, which is well below the actual cost to the club which is approximately \$23.

The President asked if the Board members have received any candidates for election for the Board of Directors. The Skeet Chairman advised that member John Rea would like to take his position. Member Mel Haag was contacted and stated that he would run for the Board, if needed.

Last month, the President requested that all BOD members submit a wish list of proposed improvements with cost estimates to the Treasure. The goal was to prioritize these proposed improvements and provide them to the membership at the Winter Business Meeting. Member George Clutter received the lists from the Treasurer and compiled them for the Board meeting. Each item was discussed and given a priority number. Some items were dropped because they were not feasible or too expensive. The remaining items will be discussed at the winter meeting.

Also last month, the Board approved the purchase of three portable sporting clays machines for \$6,000. The Range Manager stated that the purchase is still in works.

The Board spoke with member Harry Hettinger about taking pictures of the club facilities and having them posted on the NTSA website. Harry asked permission to take some instructional videos and the Vice President offered to assist him.

Under new business, the Rifle Chairman presented a request to move the Precision Rimfire match, which is starting on December 19<sup>th</sup>, from Sunday to Saturday. The Board discussed, but did not approve this request because of the large number of benchrest and other rifle shooters that use the 100/200 yard range on Saturday. The Board believed that the Sunday schedule would impact those shooters the least.

Member George Clutter raised an issue on the 200-yard rifle range that there is evidence of bullets striking weeds and trees a few feet above the berms. It is unknown whether or not these rounds are caused by bullets skipping of the ground, or by improperly sighting in rifles. The Board discussed installing baffles and/or raising the berms. The Board acknowledged that the berms are in need of periodic maintenance, but that raising the berms is not the solution to the problem, and baffles could severely impact competition. The President requested that the Rifle and Pistol Chairmen investigate other ranges in the DFW area that have baffles or other means to keep rounds within their property boundaries and report back to the Board for further discussion and resolution.

Also under new business, at the request of several members, the Pistol Chairman presented a proposal for adopting an Optional Range Fee for Pistol and Rifle (ORF). The optional fee would be \$100 per year in addition to the annual dues and would apply to pistol and rifle ranges only. By paying the annual fee, the member would not pay the \$3 daily fee for using the rifle and pistol ranges. Under this proposal, the fee would only apply to an individual member and not the entire family. In addition, the fee would only apply to casual shooting and not a sanctioned event The Pistol Chair's proposal would require that the Range Manager maintain a list of members who have paid the fee and check it against the daily sign-in

sheet. The members who use this option would write "ORF" in the box under "Rifle" or "Pistol" in lieu of the \$3 fee. This fee would benefit the members who use the pistol or rifle ranges more than three times per month. The Board discussed the concept in general and decided that there would be a number of positive benefits and that the proposal would probably increase the club's income rather than decrease it. The Board then discussed the amount to charge each member annually and did not come to an agreement. The amounts ranged from \$60 to \$100 annually. However, the Board did agree to approve the ORF on a trial basis to end on May 31<sup>st</sup> for a pro-rated amount of \$50, effective immediately. The Skeet Chairman suggested that the ORF include not just the individual paying the fee, but also the individual's wife. There were no objections to this suggestion. The President asked the Range Manager to maintain a list of those members that paid the ORF fee and consider adding something to the membership card to indicate that the fee was paid. As stated above, the Board approved the ORF on a trial basis and will monitor the program over the next several months and decide to continue or discontinue it prior to June 1<sup>st</sup>. The decision to discontinue the program will be made if it is determined that the club is loosing income.

As reported last month, the Board received a resignation letter from the Range Manager, Bob Carmichael, which is effective April 30<sup>th</sup>, 2011. The Board has a highly qualified individual in mind and intends to have him hired by April 1<sup>st</sup> so that he can learn the day-to-day operations from Bob before he leaves. That individual is currently employed and asked that his name not be announced until March.

#### **Precision Rimfire Rifle Competition**

The first Precision Rimfire Rifle competition will be held on Sunday, December 19<sup>th</sup> on the 100/200 yard rifle range. The match will vary each month, but primarily consists of shooting paper targets at 50, 100, and 200 yards from the bench using a bipod and a rear rest, and shooting targets at 50 yards standing offhand (unsupported). Any precision rimfire rifle is welcome. You will need approximately 100 rounds of quality rimfire ammunition. The match begins at 0900. Registration ends at 0830 and the safety briefing begins at 0840. You will need to attend the safety briefing in order to shoot. Mike Plaxco is the match director. He recommends that if your rifle/scope combination is sighted-in with a 100-yard zero, you will need about 18 - 19 minutes of angle elevation for 200 yards, depending on the ammunition used.

#### **Updated Range Safety Rules**

Please check the reference section on the NTSA website for the updated safety rules, or stop by the club for a copy. All members and their guests are requested to abide by the NTSA safety rules and to review them periodically.

#### **Steel Reactive Target Training**

The Steel Reactive Target Training Classes will resume next year. A schedule will be announced in the newsletter and posted on the website. NTSA members may use steel reactive targets with .22 rimfire ammunition when in compliance with the NTSA policy and after completing a NTSA training course. The class is from 9AM to 11 AM. Please email Gary at <u>fs5621@yahoo.com</u> to register and to obtain the course materials and instructions on what to bring. There is no charge for the class, but three members are needed to hold the class.
