**President's Message – Jerry Stiller** (Jerry is traveling to the NRA Show and so the VP is filling in for him this month.) The club is doing very well income- wise, and we are having a lot of activity. This is great that the club is being utilized, but we have noticed evidence on Pistol Bay 1 and the 50-yard Intermediate range that rounds are being fired that skip off of the ground. In addition, shot up aluminum cans have been found. It is absolutely vital that all rounds impact into the berm, and is the responsibility of every shooter that this is done. It is club policy that no targets of any kind be placed directly on the ground. Since the Range Manager cannot be on the pistol and rifle ranges all the time, it is incumbent on all members to ensure that this doesn't happen. Any unsafe practice that is observed should be stopped immediately, or reported to the Range Manager.

## Reminders

- <u>Please pay \$150.00 annual dues by June 1<sup>st</sup>.</u>
- The ranges are closed on Monday until 1PM.
- Please observe the posted speed limit of 7 mph.

### **Safety Notices**

- Do not shoot any target placed directly on the ground.
- Make sure that your rounds fired impact into the berm and do not skip off of the ground.
- <u>All shooters on the rifle and pistol ranges should ensure that the rounds they fire pass through the black plastic backers and impact into the berms. Please place targets in the center of the plastic backer and avoid shooting the wood frames or the metal posts.</u>

The attendance was good with 12 shooters, including 6 NTSA members and 6 non-members. The overall winners were first place, Dwain M., Tactical Division, second place, Fred P., Tactical Division, and third place, Steve H..., Iron Division. The lowest points down were first place, John H. with 30, and second place, Gary R. with 49. The next Carbine match is on June 12<sup>th</sup> at 9AM. Registration ends at 8:30 AM.

The NBRSA Texas Showdown will be held on Saturday June 5<sup>th</sup> and Sunday, June 6th. This should be a big benchrest event.

Congratulations to Ralph Stewart, one of our benchrest shooters, who recently traveled to Pennsylvania to compete in a world benchrest event. He placed 2<sup>nd</sup> overall in two-gun and, pending confirmation, set a world record for 200 yards.

#### Pistol Chairman Report – Larry Erbskorn

The NTSA Action Pistol has had a tough time with weather the last two months, and has been cancelled each time. The next match is scheduled for this coming Saturday, May 15<sup>th</sup>. However, the forecast is 40% chance of rain. If this happens, the match will be held the following Saturday instead of the Club Pistol Steel Shoot.

The Club Pistol Steel Shoot is normally held the fourth Saturday of the month at 9AM. It is timed, but not scored, and is very relaxed. It affords members and guests a great opportunity to shoot steel targets with pistols in .22 rimfire, 9mm, .40 S&W, .45 ACP, etc. Skeet Chairman Report – Sam Voss

### Land Acquisition Poll

The membership pole is now closed on the NTSA website. The following report is the same as last month.

We had a total of 28 members respond to the poll. A quick synopsis is as follows:

- 32% of the members support a dues increase only
- 39% support a dues and membership increase
- 11% support a dues and membership increase, and an assessment
- 7% would like the club to do nothing.

Of the members that support a dues and membership increase:

- 23% support \$200 dues and 700 membership cap
- 38% support \$200 dues and 800 membership cap
- 23% combined support \$300 dues and 700-800 membership

#### **Road Repair**

In February, the Board authorized the Range Manager to have the road graded and the pot holes filled with gravel. The work was supposed to be done when the weather allowed. However, the Range Manager has had difficulties finding someone to do the work. The Range Manager advised the Board that he will purchase a load of gravel and have the pot holes filled until a more permanent solution can be found.

#### **Prone Shooting Positions**

The Rifle Chairman received a bid to construct the prone shooting platform. The Board requested that the bid be revised to include labor only, and not materials. The Board prefers that commercial concrete be used to build the positions rather than mix the concrete by hand. One awning support poll needs to be moved by the members prior to the concrete being poured.

The raised prone shooting platform will be constructed on the rifle range next to the entrance gate. The approved plan will maintain the four-foot walk way that currently exists. The platform will be constructed of concrete blocks with a poured concrete slab and will provide three prone shooting positions. No concrete benches will be taken out and no firing will be done forward of the firing line. The structure will not reduce the rifle range entrance gate at all.

#### **Steel Reactive Target Training**

NTSA members may use steel reactive targets with .22 rimfire ammunition when in compliance with the NTSA policy and after completing a NTSA training course. A NTSA Steel Reactive Target Training class was held on April 24<sup>th</sup> with four members attending. The remaining schedule for 2010 is as follows:

- Saturday, July 31
- Saturday, October 30th

#### **Membership Cap Increase**

The Board approved an increase in the membership cap from 600 to 700. There are approximately 87 applicants on the waiting list at this time, which will be contacted.

If an applicant on the list is called and is unable to join at that time, he or she will be moved to the back of the list for one time only. However, if an applicant on the list fails to respond within 30 days, the \$50 is forfeited.

Members are invited to set up a table, use the back of their pickup, or display items on a ground cover adjacent to the club house and across the road from the clubhouse. Please do not interfere with trap and skeet shooters.
